Election to authorize renewal of additional levy of the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2021, July 1, 2022, July 1, 2023, July 1, 2024, and July 1, 2025, respectively. The purposes for which funds are needed are to maintain and improve the instructional programs and the operation of school services for the Jefferson County Public Schools as follows:

Should any of the purposes, set forth above, be declared unconstitutional or invalid, by judicial or legislative action, the funds will be used for other purposes, set forth above and not affected by the judicial or legislative action.

The Board of Education of the County of Jefferson may reduce the said levy rates in any given year or years during the term of this levy after determining the sufficiency of funds for school purposes for the next school year.

In the event additional funds are obtained by grant or otherwise from the state or federal government, or from any other source, such additional funds may be used either in substitution for, upon a corresponding reduction in the said levy rate and following a determination concerning the sufficiency of funds for school purposes, or in addition to, the funds obtained from the levy.

The Board of Education of Jefferson County is hereby authorized to expend any excess funds raised by the levy rate herein set forth to accommodate growth as follows:

Personnel Board Discretion 80% of the excess amount raised 20% of the excess amount raised

In the event the levy fails to generate the amount listed above (\$22,412,937) in any fiscal year, the Board of Education of Jefferson County is hereby authorized to reduce the levy funds expended for Items A-F in its sole discretion.

All according to the order of the Board of Education of the County of Jefferson, entered on the 27th day of July, 2020.

The renewal of additional levy in cents on each one hundred dollars assessed valuation as approved on November 3, 2020, shall be on Class I property – 22.95; on Class II property – 45.90; on Class III property – 91.80; and, on Class IV property - 91.80.

Shall The Board of Education of the County of Jefferson (the "Board") incur debt and issue Bonds in the amount of \$43,735,000, with maturities on such Bonds to run not more than fifteen and one quarter (15 1/4) years from the date of such bonds, and with interest not exceeding the rate of five percent (5.00%) per annum, payable semiannually, for the purposes of designing, planning, developing, constructing, acquiring, improving, equipping and/or furnishing certain school building facilities and related real property, as more particularly described in the project list set forth below (collectively, the "Projects") in the Jefferson County Public School District (the "School District") to provide adequate, safe and convenient facilities for the School District, and levy taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such Bonds:

The amounts set forth above as "Bond Funds" for the Project include estimated Costs of Issuance for the Bonds and are to be funded from the proceeds of the Bonds that would be issued in the aggregate principal amount of Forty-Three Million Seven Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$43,735,000), which amount also constitutes the Total Proposed Bond Call. The Board shall be authorized to pay such Costs of Issuance from its general funds and/or the proceeds of the Bonds, as the Board deems appropriate at the time such Costs of Issuance are required to be paid.

If the bond issue is approved by the voters of the School District, the Board receives an award of West Virginia School Building Authority funds sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to undertake and complete the Projects and the Bonds proposed hereby are issued, then (a) upon the completion of new Shepherdstown Elementary School, existing Shepherdstown Elementary School would be closed as an elementary school, and students in grades K-5 would be assigned to and attend the new Shepherdstown Elementary School; and (b) upon the completion of the new Ranson Elementary School, existing Ranson Elementary School would be closed as an elementary school, , and students in grades K-5 would be assigned to and attend the new Ranson Elementary School.

If the voters of the School District approve the incurring of said debt and the issuance of said Bonds, the Board will lay annually upon the assessed valuation of all the taxable property within the School District a levy sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the annual interest upon the Bonds as such interest accrues semiannually and the principal of the Bonds at maturity, for which purposes a levy upon each \$100 valuation, based upon the last assessment of such property for State and County purposes, will be required as follows:

The foregoing amounts include the costs of acquiring any necessary lands, sites and rights-of-way and easements, if any, and any engineering and architectural costs, construction costs, including, but not limited to, construction manager fees and expenses, the cost of using county maintenance personnel, the costs of erecting, improving, equipping and furnishing the Projects, the costs and estimated costs of the issuance of the Bonds, interest during the construction of the Projects, if any, and such other costs, fees, and expenses as may be necessary and/or properly incurred in carrying out the Projects. All Handicapped and E.S.S.I.A. Title 1 expenditures are subject to written approval by the West Virginia Department of Education.

The issuance of the Bonds may be subject to (i) the West Virginia School Building Authority's timely award of funds to the Board in amounts sufficient, in the Board's reasonable discretion, to undertake and complete the Projects and (ii) any and all other necessary actions, approvals and consents required by applicable law; provided, however, such award of funds by the West Virginia School Building Authority shall not be a condition precedent to the issuance of the Bonds.

To the extent permitted by applicable law and in accordance with that certain Reimbursement Resolution adopted by the Board on August 3, 2020 the Board shall be permitted to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the Bonds for Project costs and expenses incurred prior to the issuance of the Bonds.

If for any reason, any sums remain unused upon completion of the Projects, such unused sums may be allocated by the Board in its discretion, (i) for capital expenditures for the enrichment, supplementation, and advancement of all education programs in Jefferson County, and other purposes pertinent to the operation of the schools within the School District and/or (ii) for use in the acquisition, construction, design, renovation, improvement, furnishing, and/or equipping of the Projects. If the proceeds of the Bonds and/or amounts allocated for the above-stated purposes are insufficient to complete the Projects, then the Board, in its discretion, shall allocate such shortfall to one or more of the above-stated purposes. In the event the Board shall obtain additional money by grant or otherwise from the state or federal government, or from any agency of either, or from any other source, for use in the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement, furnishing, and/or equipping of the Projects, such additional money may be used either in substitution for or in addition to the proceeds of the Bonds proposed hereby, as may be determined by the Board and the granting body or agency, unless otherwise set forth herein.
