

- The concept plan will conserve the park's existing natural and cultural resources, while also offering diverse recreational opportunities

Goal is to "Design and implement a grand vision for Sam Michaels Park that elevates the park to a true County-scale and "the premiere" park facility for Jefferson County."

- Champions for implementation








Sam Michaels Park Overivew

- JCPRC's largest and most diverse park asset
- 138 acres
- Athletic fields and courts
- 6.8 miles of trails
- Jefferson County Community Center
- Veteran's Memorial Pavilion & Playground
- Sam Michaels Park Pavilion
- The Columns
- Dog Park
- Amphitheater









Sam Michaels Park



- Outdoor performance amphitheater and new concrete stage
- 500 permanent seats;
 700 informal seats (picnicking)
- Central activity field
- \$2.5 capital improvement – demonstrates partnerships for success
- Family-focused, modest scale performance venue






Sam Michaels Park

Jefferson County Parks & Recreation

- Elks Run Watershed
 Elks Branch Creek
 and Elks Run
- Drainage area of 18 square miles includes the entire park
- Harpers Ferry Source Water Protection
- Chesapeake Bay TMDL




