C.E.R.T. (Community Emergency Response Team) Training to be Held

CERT Training Class begins April 8, 2013 in Jefferson County!

Jefferson County Homeland Security & Emergency Management prepares everyday for emergencies. However, during a disaster, the number and scope of incidents can overwhelm conventional emergency services. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program is an all-risk, all-hazard training. This valuable course is designed to help you protect yourself, your family, your neighbors and your neighborhood in an emergency situation.

Community-based preparedness planning allows us all to prepare for and respond to anticipated disruptions and potential hazards following a disaster. As individuals, we can prepare our homes and families to cope during that critical period. Through pre-event planning, neighborhoods and worksites can also work together to help reduce injuries, loss of lives, and property damage. Neighborhood preparedness will enhance the ability of individuals and neighborhoods to reduce their emergency needs and to manage their existing resources until professional assistance becomes available.

This training covers skills that are important to know in a disaster when emergency services are not immediately available. With training and practice, and by working as a team, you will be able to protect yourself and do the greatest good for the greatest number after a disaster. The training is designed for citizens with little or no training in the areas listed below, but those with some skills in these areas are also welcome to attend the training and participate in CERT. Homeowners or neighborhood groups, PTA's, service and social clubs, churches, businesses, or a group of individuals from a neighborhood are ideal groups to form CERT teams. The only requirements are that you be over 18 years old and live or work in Jefferson County. Basic skills are taught in the areas of: Disaster Preparedness, Fire Safety, Disaster Medical Operations I and II; Terrorism Preparedness and Crime Prevention; Disaster Psychology, Special Populations and Animals in Disaster; Light Search and Rescue and CERT Volunteerism. All students participate in a final exercise at the end of the course.

Jefferson County to participate in Operation Newton VA Center Tabletop Exercise on March 14 and Full Scale Exercise, April 4, 2013

Jefferson County has been asked to participate in the Veteran Administration's Operation Newton Tabletop Exercise on March 14th and Full Scale Exercise on April 4, 2013. The purpose of this exercise is to measure and validate performance of the following capabilities and their associated critical tasks. The selected capabilities are:

Communications
Implement On-Site Incident Management
Evacuation
Emergency Public Information and Warning
Public Safety and Security Response
Mass Casualties
Staging of First Responders and patient/staff families
Collapsed Structure Search and Rescue

WV State All Hazards Mitigation Plan Update

The West Virginia Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (WVDHSEM) would appreciate your participation in the development of the **West Virginia 2013 Hazard Mitigation Plan Update**. A series of five stakeholder workshops will be held April 8-12, 2013 throughout the State in order to solicit comments on the hazards facing the state and the mitigation strategies to be implemented.

Hazard mitigation involves taking proactive action in order to reduce or eliminate long-term risk to people and their property from known hazards. Mitigation planning is the process of assessing hazards and developing mitigation actions. It includes assessment of existing capabilities, prioritization of resources, and development of a detailed action plan. Meaningful mitigation planning requires statewide partnerships with people, organizations, businesses, and communities.

In developing a hazard mitigation plan, West Virginia demonstrates its commitment to the protection of life and property within its jurisdiction. It also then becomes eligible for certain types of federal non-emergency mitigation assistance through FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) program. Adoption of a federally approved mitigation plan is a prerequisite to be eligible for federal mitigation assistance funding.

Please help West Virginia make meaningful decisions on where to invest its mitigation related resources by participating in a workshop. We encourage you to pass this to local officials, business partners, local organizations, school officials and citizens with an interest in the future of your community. We need to have a diverse group representing your area in order to maximize the effectiveness of the plan and available hazard mitigation resources. MGT 405 Mobilizing Faith-Based Community Organizations in Preparing for Disaster

Jefferson County Homeland Security and Emergency Management, along with the West Virginia Department of Military Affairs and Public Safety, will host the Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium Course, "MGT-405, Mobilizing Faith-Based Community Organizations in Preparing for Disaster" on April 25 from 8 a.m.—5 p.m. at The Clarion Hotel and Conference Center in Shepherdstown.

This 8-hour, planning and management-level course trains faith-based community organization (FBCO) representatives, management-level emergency managers, and first responders from small and rural communities to strategically mobilize and engage members of FCBOs, including religious charities, nonprofits such as the Salvation Army, the American Red Cross, churches (both affiliated and unaffiliated), temples, synagogues, mosques, and NGOs etc., in a reciprocal approach to disaster planning that is integrated into current local and statewide emergency management efforts.

This course emphasizes grassroots mobilization and coordination efforts as a means of engaging all faith communities, thereby reaching those marginalized communities most vulnerable to disaster, most frequently excluded from the planning process, and ultimately, most difficult to aid in recovery. This course introduces vital emergency management concepts to FBCO leaders, many of whom will have had no prior experience with emergency management and also seeks to educate emergency managers and first responders about the critical role FBCOs can play in strengthening preparedness.

RCPG REQUIRES the following pre-requisites: IS-100.b – Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS) IS-700.a NIMS, an Introduction Participant must be a U.S. citizen.

Core Capabilities that will be covered by this class include: Community Resilience, Critical Transportation, Housing, Infrastructure Systems, Mass Care Services, Operations Coordination, Planning, Public and Private Services and Resources, and Public Information and Warning.

DRAFT of Jefferson County All Hazards Risk Assessment and Mitigation Plan out for Review Comments to be received through March 21st

The Jefferson County Hazard Mitigation Core Planning Committee recently completed an update to the Jefferson County Multi-Jurisdictional All-Hazard Mitigation Plan.

This plan identifies the hazards to which Jefferson County is susceptible as well as a variety of projects that can be undertaken to lessen the effects of those hazards. The following jurisdictions are included in the plan: Town of Bolivar, City of Charles Town, Town of Harpers Ferry, City of Ranson, Corporation of Shepherdstown, and the unincorporated areas of Jefferson County.

The Jefferson County Multi-Jurisdictional All-Hazard Mitigation Plan was developed in 2003 and revised in 2008 per federal requirements in Section 322 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, as enacted by Section 104 of the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000. The plan must be reviewed/updated/re-adopted and submitted to FEMA every 5 years. The plan expires 7/25/13.

The updated document is available for review at the office of Jefferson County Homeland Security & Emergency Management at 28 Industrial Blvd., Suite 101, Kearneysville, WV 25430, also at the Jefferson County Commission Office located at 124 East Washington Street, Charles Town, WV 25414 and at the following website: http://www.jeffersoncountywv.org/flood-plain-information/all-hazard-risk-assessment-and-mitigation-plan.html. A form will be provided at the aforementioned locations and online to document any comments. All comments must be submitted by March 21, 2013.

Steering Committee, John Sherwood, Chair

The Steering Committee works with the JCHSEM Director to guide the activities of JCHSEM. A fourteen-member Steering Committee is made up of public and private representation. JCHSEM is a Department within the Jefferson County Commission, who has overall responsibility for the department and its employees. The Jefferson County Commission appoints all members to the steering committee. This committee meets on the 4th Tuesday of February. March, May, June, August, September and holds a Nov/Dec meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the JCHSEM EOC at 28 Industrial Blvd., Kearneysville, unless otherwise announced. The Quarterly Partnership meetings held in January, April, July, and October also serve as the Steering Committee meetings for those months.

Public Awareness, Education and Training Committee, Kelly Parsons, Chair

Any interested person can serve on this committee. The Public Awareness, Education and Training Committee is responsible to communicate the organization's activities to the public and to build support for JCHSEM's programs. They work with the Director and other staff to keep the entire community focused on the objectives of JCHSEM, the opportunities for additional involvement and support by updating citizens and businesses about what the partners are doing and how the community will and is benefiting from these efforts. Risk Assessment and Mitigation Planning Committee, Jeff Jefferies, Chair

Any interested person may serve on this committee. The Risk Assessment/Mitigation Planning Committee will examine the community's risks and vulnerability to all hazards and assess the community's vulnerability to those risks. Additionally, they will look at specific buildings, infrastructure, etc. to determine which are most susceptible to risks. A Risk Assessment and Mitigation Plan was completed and adopted by the Jefferson County Commission, all Jefferson County municipalities, WVOHSEM, and Federal Emergency Management Agency in July, 2003; updated the original document in 2008. The 2013 Plan is now being developed. This committee meets on an "as needed basis". Please call the office at 728-3329 for exact dates and times.

Counter Terrorism Committee, Barbara Miller, Director, Chair

Membership to this sub-committee of the Risk Assessment and Mitigation Planning Committee is limited to members of law enforcement, emergency management, homeland security, emergency communications, Red Cross, schools, health care, fire companies, ambulance authority/EMS, and government, due to sensitive homeland security issues. The committee works on issues of planning and training for counter terrorism or human-caused disasters.
