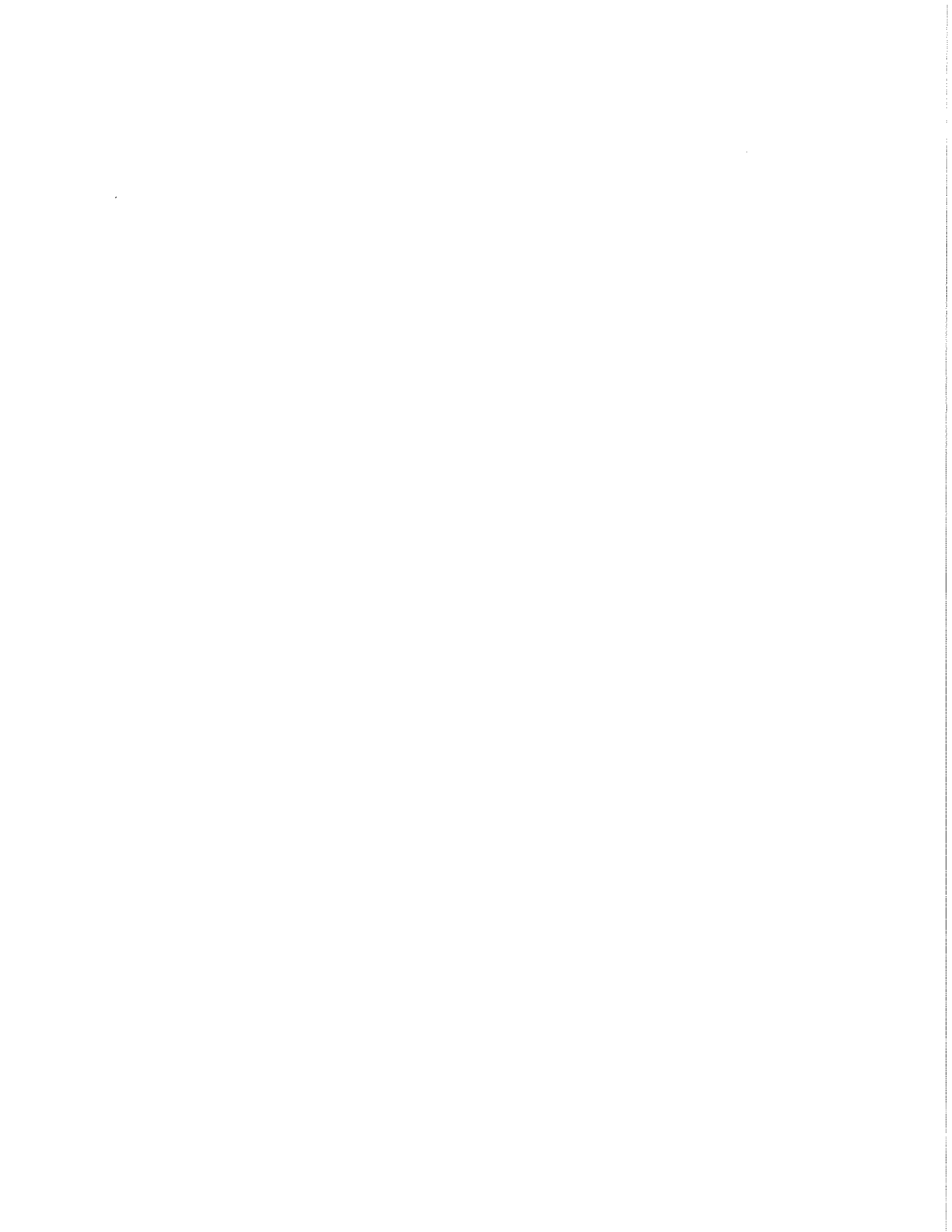

**In re: Discussion of issues concerning the Jefferson County Public Service District and receive legal advice from counsel about the Commission interaction with the District, Charles Town, Ranson, and the Public Service Commission regarding sewer services and potential comments in Case No. 16-0616-PSD-PC-CN before the Public Service Commission, including the public comment hearing on January 19, 2017.**

**Discussion of changes requested by the County Commission to the proposed Zoning Ordinance text amendment (ZTA16-01)**

The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Commissioner Onoszko.

Commissioner Compton led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Onoszko asked for unanimous consent to allow the members in the audience to address the Commission. The Commission agreed. Comments were made by the following:

- Wayne Morgan, Thrasher Engineering and Sue Lawton, General Manager of the Jefferson County Public Service District – provided an explanation of the sewer systems improvement project, including a cost breakdown totaling \$6.5 million dollars and a two year building period. Both parties noted that the Public Service District is currently at or beyond the peak flow limit, and if the project is not approved, there may be overflows in customers' homes.
- Peggy Smith, Mayor of Charles Town – Ms. Smith stated that although she wishes to continue dialogue with Ranson and the County Commission regarding the total acquisition of the JCPSD assets, the approval of the sewer systems improvement project could jeopardize consolidation as acquiring the added debt would complicate the City's ability to keep District rates under control and equal with current Charles Town rates.
- Duke Pierson, Mayor of Ranson, and Andy Blake, City Manager of Ranson – stated they were not prepared to make a statement at this time as they were still awaiting more direction from the Commission regarding the possibility of total utility consolidation.

- John Reisenweber, Director, Jefferson County Development Authority – spoke in favor of a sewer improvement project as it would be helpful to future residents and businesses.
- Jacqueline Milliron, resident – spoke against the sewer improvement project as the current water and sewer rates for District customers are very high, and with no potential new customers, current customers would have to bear the burden of the cost of the improvement project.
- **There being no further comment, motion by Ms. Tabb to enter into Executive Session. Motion seconded and unanimously approved.**
- **Motion by Ms. Noland to come out of Executive Session. Motion seconded and unanimously approved.**
- **Motion by Mr. Onoszko to send a letter to the West Virginia Public Service Commission expressing opposition to the JCPSD sewer improvement project. Motion seconded and passes on a vote of 3-2 with Ms. Noland and Ms. Tabb opposing.**

Ms. Noland noted she would send her own letter to the West Virginia Public Service Commission providing her personal opinion regarding the sewer improvement project. Mr. Onoszko requested Commissioner Compton work with Ms. Grove and Mr. Cochran to draft the letter of opposition. Mr. Onoszko also requested all letters from County Commissioners regarding the sewer systems improvement project be compiled and sent to the Public Service Commission by January 31, 2017.

The Commission also discussed amendments to the Jefferson County Zoning and Land Development Ordinance (ZTA16-01). It was the consensus of the body to request Ms. Beaulieu change all Commercial Uses in the Residential and Rural Zoning Districts from Not Permitted to Conditional and develop additional criteria for the Commercial Uses under the Conditional Use Permitting Process to be presented at a later meeting.

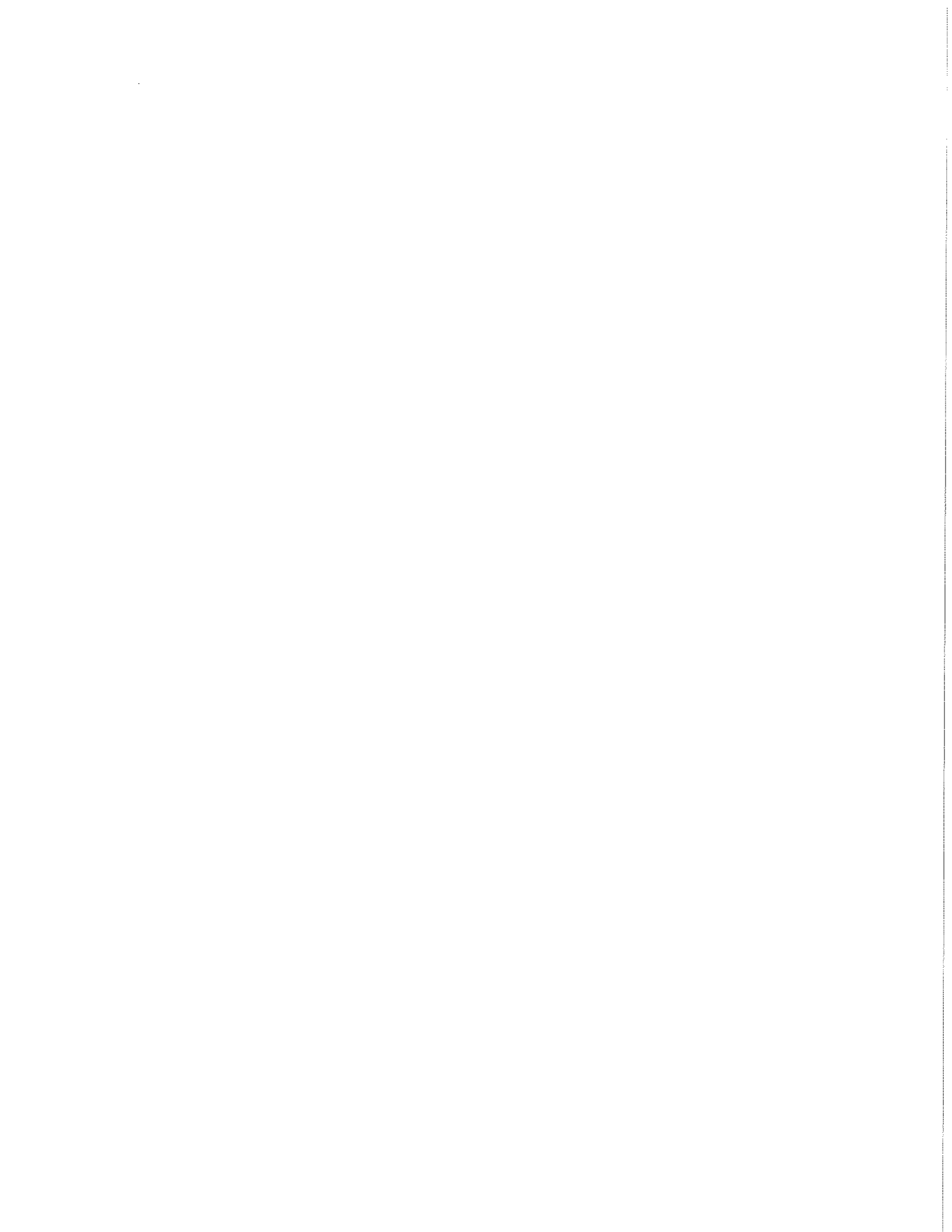

Ladies and Gentlemen:

With an initial sum of less than \$5,000.00, described on Schedule A attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference, the **Jefferson County Historic Landmarks Commission (JCHLC)** (hereafter "we") wishes to establish a component fund with the **Eastern West Virginia Community Foundation** (hereafter "the Foundation"). The initial contribution, which will be less than \$5,000.00, will be placed in a separate subaccount maintained by the Foundation until the amount of the monies in the subaccount equal or exceed \$5,000.00. All monies shall immediately upon contribution become the property of the Foundation and shall not be refundable under any circumstances. Contributions to the separate subaccount may be made by any person or organization at any time. If the amount of the monies in the separate subaccount does not equal or exceed \$5,000.00 within five years after the date of this letter, all money in the sub-account shall be redirected at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Once the monies in the separate subaccount equal or exceed \$5,000.00, the subaccount shall constitute a restricted fund to be maintained by the Foundation.

The fund shall be known as the "Eastern West Virginia Community Foundation **Our History Our Community Fund**" which name shall be used at all times when referring to the fund (hereafter "the Fund"). Any public display or event or fundraising program that mentions the Fund shall require prior written consent of the Foundation. The Fund shall be held, administered and distributed as follows:

1. The Fund shall be a component fund of the Foundation of the type known as an **agency fund**, and shall be maintained by the Foundation pursuant hereto for the benefit of the **Jefferson County Historic Landmarks Commission** of Jefferson County, West Virginia (hereafter "the designated charitable beneficiary).

2. We recommend that the investment advisor that shall hold the Fund shall be determined by the Board of Directors or its assigned committee. We understand that

investment advisor fees will be calculated and deducted from the Fund based on the practice and policy of the investment advisor selected for my fund.

3. The Fund shall be open-ended, i.e. additional contributions of cash or property are permitted to be made by any person or entity.

4. The Fund is intended as a perpetual endowment for charitable purposes and shall be dedicated to the payment of grants from time to time as described below (hereafter "the charitable purpose") as calculated under the Foundation's Spending Policy in effect from time to time. We recognize that annual distribution amounts are based on twenty (20) quarter market average, the Fund's historic dollar value, and the Fund's investment return, under the Foundation's current policies as amended. We recognize that the Foundation's policy to protect the Fund's historic dollar value may result in no annual distribution being made in a given year. The Fund's investment gains will be reinvested until the fund reaches \$100,000 in value at which time annual distributions to support the charitable purpose will be directed to the designated charitable beneficiary will commence.

The charitable purpose of the Fund shall be to provide distributions to the Jefferson County Historic Landmarks Commission to support a grant program for stabilization and maintenance of historic structures, or the purchase and maintenance of battlefield land in the unincorporated areas of Jefferson County, West Virginia.

5. We recognize and consent that the Fund is subject to the terms and provisions of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Foundation, including the ability of the Board of Directors of the Foundation (a) to modify any restriction or condition on the distribution of funds for any specified charitable purpose or purposes or to a specified charitable organization or organizations if in the sole judgment of the Board (without the necessity of the approval of any participating trustee, custodian, or agent), such restriction or condition becomes, in effect, unnecessary, incapable of fulfillment, or inconsistent with the charitable needs of the community or area served; (b) to replace any participating trustee, custodian, or agent for breach of fiduciary duty under West Virginia law; and (c) to replace any participating trustee, custodian, or agent for failure to produce a reasonable return of net income over a reasonable period of time, as determined by the Board all without the necessity of obtaining my approval or the approval of any other person or interested party.

6. We recognize that the Fund must be approved by the Board of Directors of the Foundation, and will not be approved if implementation of the objectives of the Fund are not within the parameters permitted so that such implementation would negatively impact on the Foundation's status as a tax-exempt organization exempt from income taxes as a community foundation under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

7. We recognize that the Foundation's annual administrative fee of one percent (1%) will be calculated and deducted from the Fund under the Foundation's Spending Policy as it may be amended.

8. The Foundation is authorized in its discretion to direct the investment advisors to invest any part or all of the Fund in securities or in other property, real or personal, as ordinarily prudent businessmen are investing their own funds from time to time, without regard to any statute or law now or hereafter in force in the State of West Virginia restricting

**RE: Conditional Use Permit Process as it relates to ZTA16-01**

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The Zoning Ordinance states that the purpose of Zoning is to:

- A. Protect and encourage the health, safety, and general welfare of the present and future population of Jefferson County.
- B. Help guide the future growth and development of Jefferson County in accordance with the adopted Comprehensive Plan.
- C. Encourage growth and development in areas where sewer, water, schools, and other public facilities are or will soon be available in order to provide services in the most cost effective manner.
- D. Insure that growth and development are both economically and environmentally sound.
- E. Encourage the maintenance of an agricultural base in the County at a level sufficient to insure the continued viability of farming.
- F. Encourage and support commercial, industrial, and agricultural activities while maintaining land use, order and compatibility.
- G. Encourage an improved appearance of Jefferson County with relationship to the use and development of land and structures.
- H. Encourage the conservation of natural resources.
- I. Provide a guide for public action in the orderly and efficient provision of public facilities and services.
- J. Provide a guide for private enterprise in developing and building a strong economic community.
- K. Encourage Historic Preservation.

In short, the purpose of Zoning is to promote the health, safety, and welfare of Jefferson County, to protect and conserve the value of buildings, and encourage the most appropriate use of the land.

Zoning helps protect property values by dividing uses that are perceived as incompatible, such as keeping industrial uses (i.e. factories) separate from residential uses.

That being said, economic growth is important for a County. Historically, the County has primarily been a rural/agricultural area; however, we are receiving increasingly more inquiries to start small businesses, adapt existing structures for commercial uses (such as barns for a wedding venue or historic structures for breweries and antique shops), and other creative endeavors as a means to generate income. The Conditional Use Permit process provides a means by which property owners in residential areas can pursue commercial endeavors that may be compatible for their neighborhood.

#### **What is a Conditional Use Permit?**

A conditional use permit provides flexibility within a Zoning Ordinance. The Zoning Ordinance identifies certain land uses as “Permitted”, “Not Permitted”, and “Conditional Use”. Uses identified as “Conditional Uses” allows the County to consider uses which may be beneficial, but which are not outright permitted within a zoning district, through a public hearing process before the Board of Zoning Appeals, and subject to specific conditions of approval.

A Conditional Use Permit **does not** change a property’s zoning designation. It is a project specific change in use.

#### **Criteria for approval of a Conditional Use Permit**

The proposed amendment recommends eliminating the current process, which includes a series of criteria assessed through a point system (LESA), and implementing a traditional Conditional Use Permit process, which includes a Public Hearing and final approval by the Board of Zoning Appeals.

It is my recommendation, should the County Commission amend Appendix C to reflect all Commercial Uses currently identified as “Not Permitted” to “Conditional Use” in the Rural district, that additional criteria be added to assist the Board of Zoning Appeals in determining whether a use is appropriate for a specific site.

My primary concern is roadway adequacy and public water and sewer. It is my understanding that the market will dictate where large commercial uses locate, and therefore the availability of public water and sewer may not be a significant criteria for the Board to consider.

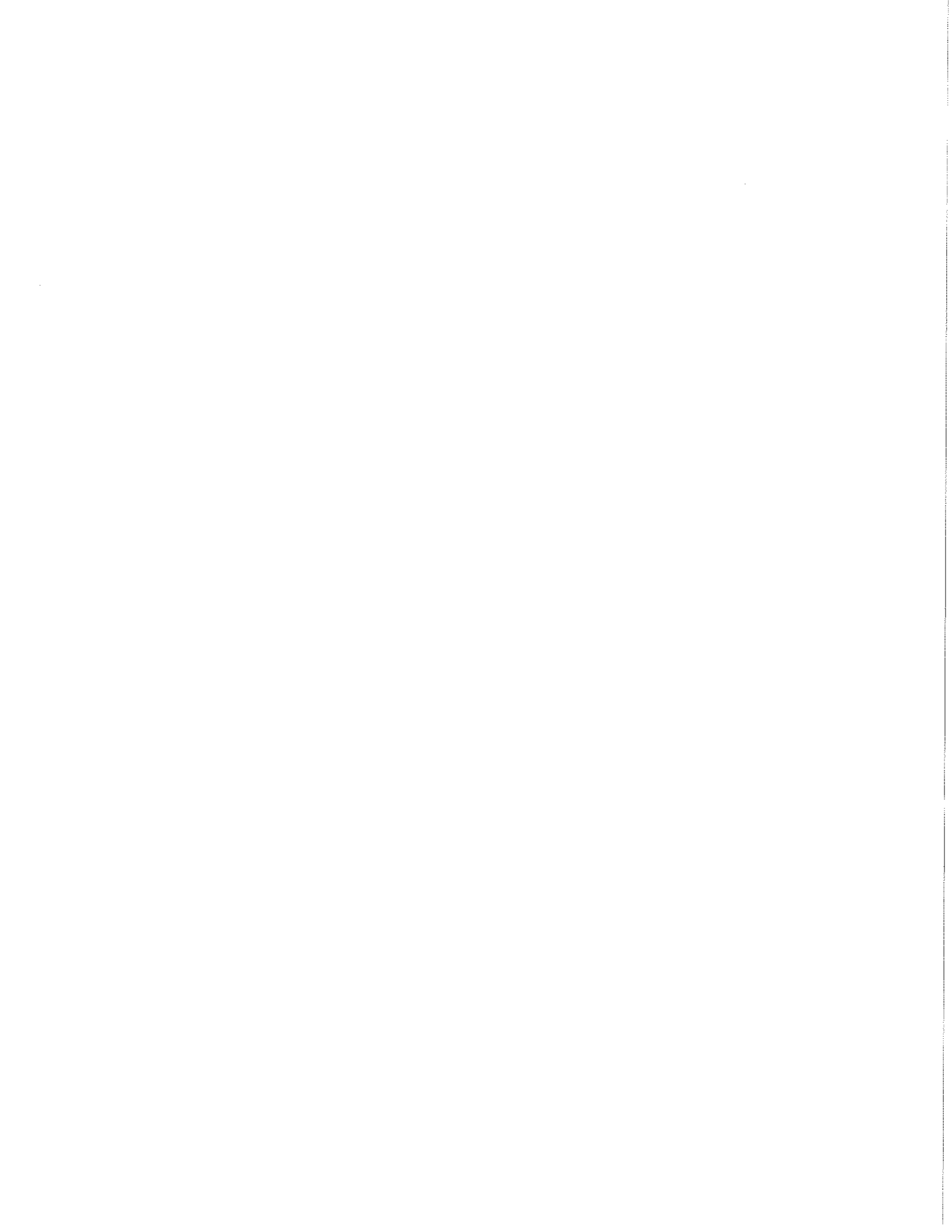
However, as you are aware, there are no County owned roads in Jefferson County. There are privately owned roads (typically owned by an HOA or private property owner) and State owned roads. If you consider the amount of traffic generated by a commercial use as opposed to a residential use, the impact is significant even on a small commercial scale. Therefore, I recommend including in the list of criteria outlined in Section 3.4A(5) (page 48),

- vi. Roadway adequacy shall be assessed by the Comprehensive Plan’s Highway Road Classification Map and Highway Problem Areas Map. If the property is zoned Rural and does not reflect commercial development on the Future Land Use Map, and does not front on an arterial or major collector road as identified in the Comprehensive Plan, the applicant shall submit trip generation data including Average Daily and Peak Hour trips for use in the BZA determining roadway adequacy for the proposed use.

Alternatively, the County Commission could consider a square footage threshold. As an example, the Dollar General located in Middleway off of Route 51 is just over 9,000 square feet and is located at the intersection of two major collector roads. A similar proposal on a minor collector or local road would have a significant negative impact on both the road and the neighborhood. Proposed language for a square footage threshold could be:

- vi. Roadway adequacy shall be assessed by the Comprehensive Plan's Highway Road Classification Map and Highway Problem Areas Map. If the property is zoned Rural and does not reflect commercial development on the Future Land Use Map, and does not front on an arterial or major collector road as identified in the Comprehensive Plan, the proposed use shall be restricted to no more than 3,000 square feet.

The Zoning Ordinance currently in effect includes a review system (LESA) that scores roadway adequacy heavily if a site is zoned Rural and not accessed off an arterial or major collector road in the County (as identified on the Roadway Classification Map in the Comprehensive Plan) and if there are highway problem areas in the vicinity. Therefore, I think it is reasonable to maintain some variation of this criteria as part of the BZA's review.










- ii. Arises from special conditions or attributes which pertain to the property for which a variance is sought and which were not created by the person seeking the variance;
  - iii. Would eliminate an unnecessary hardship and permit a reasonable use of the land; and
  - iv. Will allow the intent of the Zoning and Land Development Ordinance to be observed and substantial justice done.<sup>17, 21</sup>
- b. The owner or authorized representative of the owner of the property which is the subject of a variance request shall complete and sign forms provided for this purpose by the Board, and shall pay the associated fees. The variance request shall be filed with the Board in the Office of Planning and Zoning.
  - c. Notification for a variance must be conducted according to the requirements of Section 3.4A.3.b.
  - d. A public hearing must be conducted according to the requirements of Section 3.4A.3.c and such hearing may be continued according to the requirements of Section 3.4A.3.d.
5. The Board of Zoning Appeals shall have the authority over the issuance or denial of a conditional use permit for uses listed as “Conditional Uses (CU)” in each zoning district. The Board shall have the authority to impose such reasonable conditions and restrictions as are directly related to and incidental to the proposed conditional use permit. ~~The Board of Zoning Appeals review process for a conditional use permit application is established in Article 7 of this Ordinance.~~<sup>2, 32</sup>
- a. The Board shall consider and approve a Conditional Use Permit request with conditions or special requirements which allows for the proper integration of the proposed uses into the community subject to such reasonable conditions and restrictions as are directly related to and incidental to the proposed conditional use permit, if it finds that the following general standards have been met:
    - i. The proposed use is compatible with the goals of the adopted Comprehensive Plan.
    - ii. The proposed use is compatible in intensity and scale with the existing and potential land uses on the adjoining and confronting properties, and poses no threat to public health, safety and welfare.
    - iii. The proposed site development shall be such that the use will not hinder nor discourage the appropriate development and use of adjacent land and buildings.
    - iv. Neighborhood character and surrounding property values shall be safeguarded by requiring implementation of the landscaping buffer requirements found in Appendix B and Section 4.11 of this Ordinance.
    - v. Operations in connection with the use shall be in conformance with Section 8.9 of this Ordinance.
    - vi. Roadway adequacy shall be assessed by the Comprehensive Plan’s Highway Road Classification Map and Highway Problem Areas Map. If the property is zoned Rural and does not reflect commercial development on the Future Land Use Map, and does not front on an arterial or major collector road as identified in the Comprehensive Plan, the applicant shall submit trip generation data including Average Daily and Peak Hour trips for use in the BZA determining roadway adequacy for the proposed use.

  - 2. The powers and duties of the Jefferson County Planning Commission include but are not limited to the following:
    - a. Review applications for major site plans, major subdivisions, and waivers from minimum standards, pursuant to the Subdivision and Land Development Regulations;
    - b. Review requests for amendments to the County zoning map and Zoning and Land Development Ordinance;
    - c. Research and recommend to the County Commission improvements to the Zoning and Land Development Ordinance and the Subdivision and Land Development Regulations;
    - d. Make recommendations to the County Commission concerning planning and zoning issues;
    - e. Make an annual report to the County Commission concerning the operation of the Planning Commission and the status of planning within its jurisdiction;
    - f. Prepare the Jefferson County Comprehensive Plan and recommend to the County Commission for adoption or amendment.

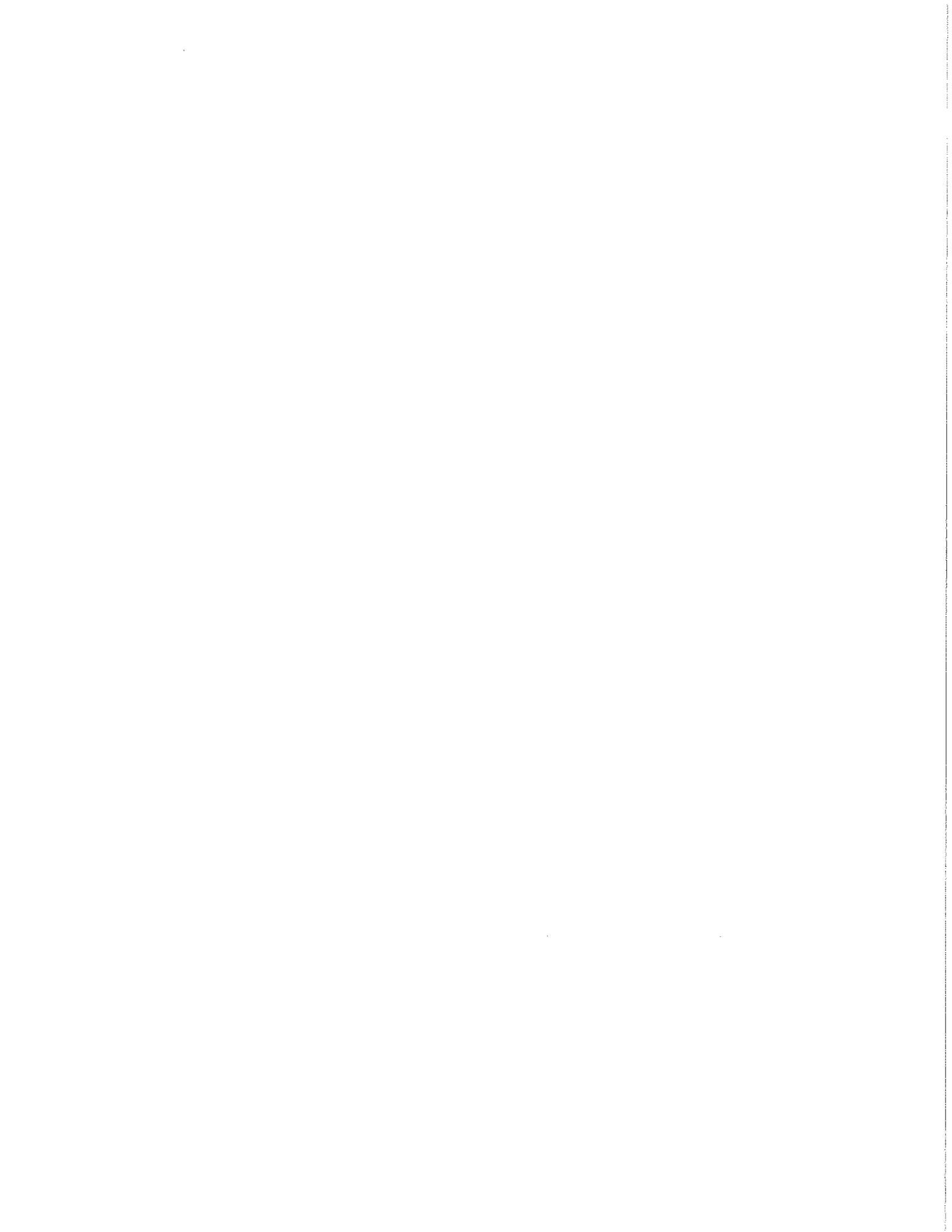

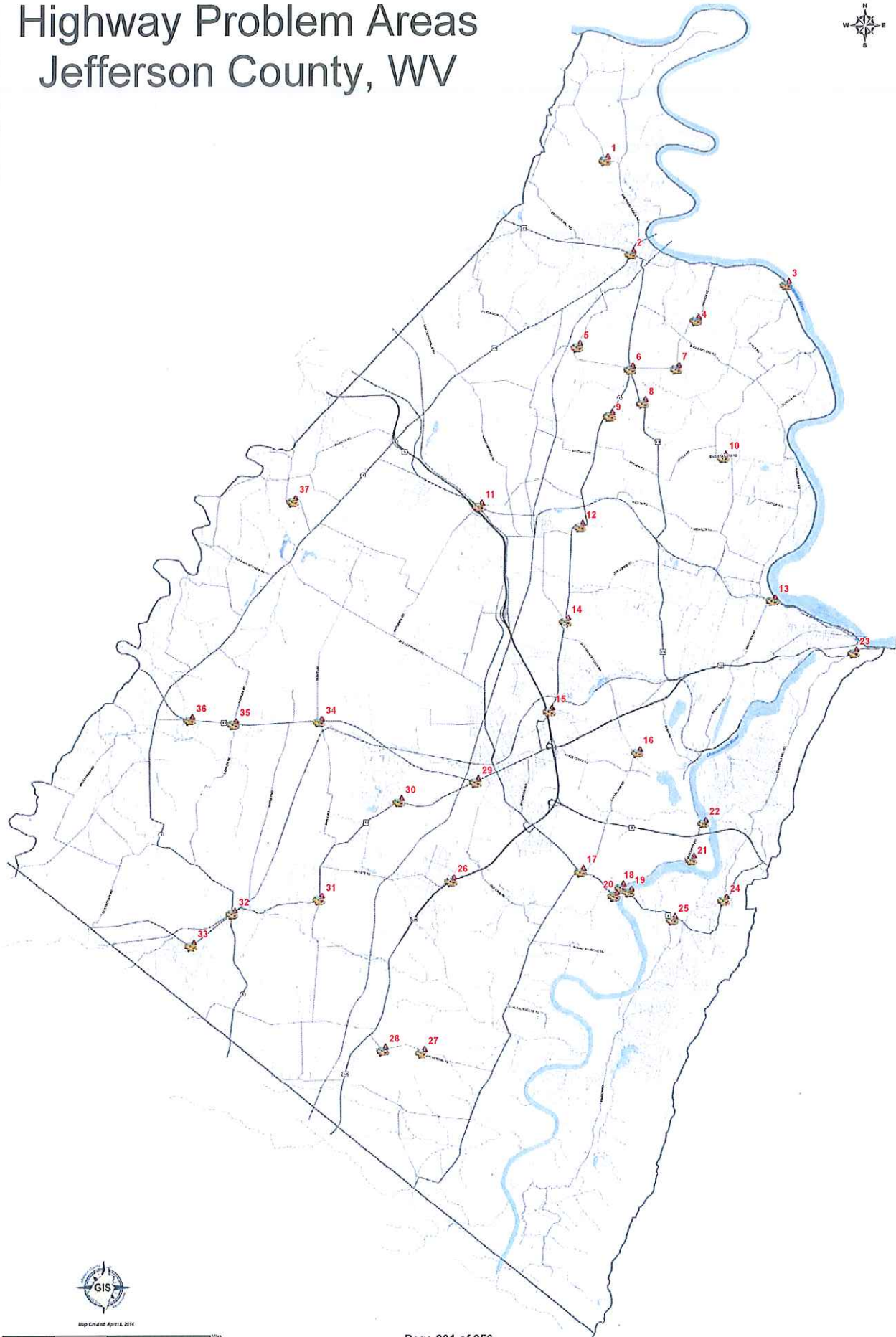

# Roadway Classification Map Envision Jefferson 2035

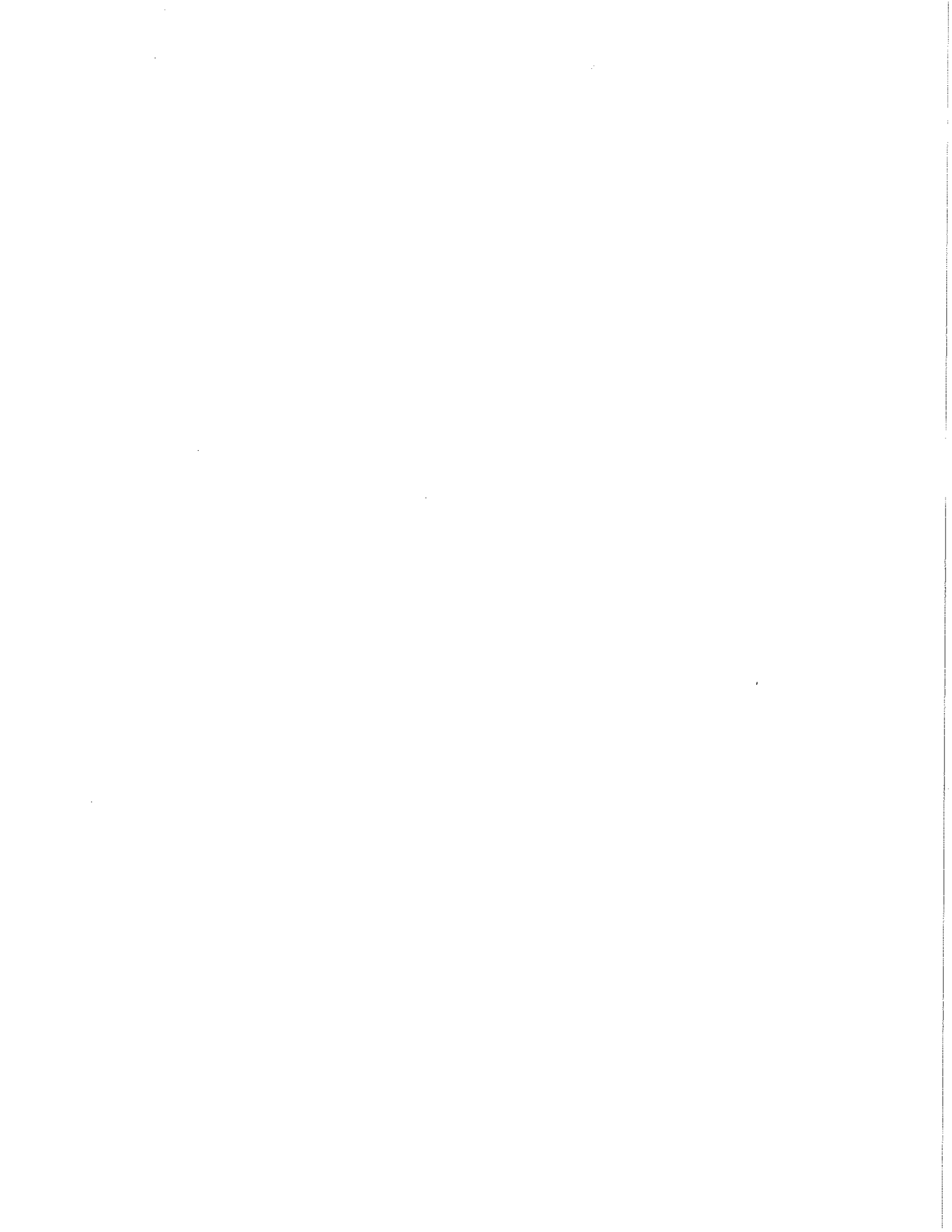


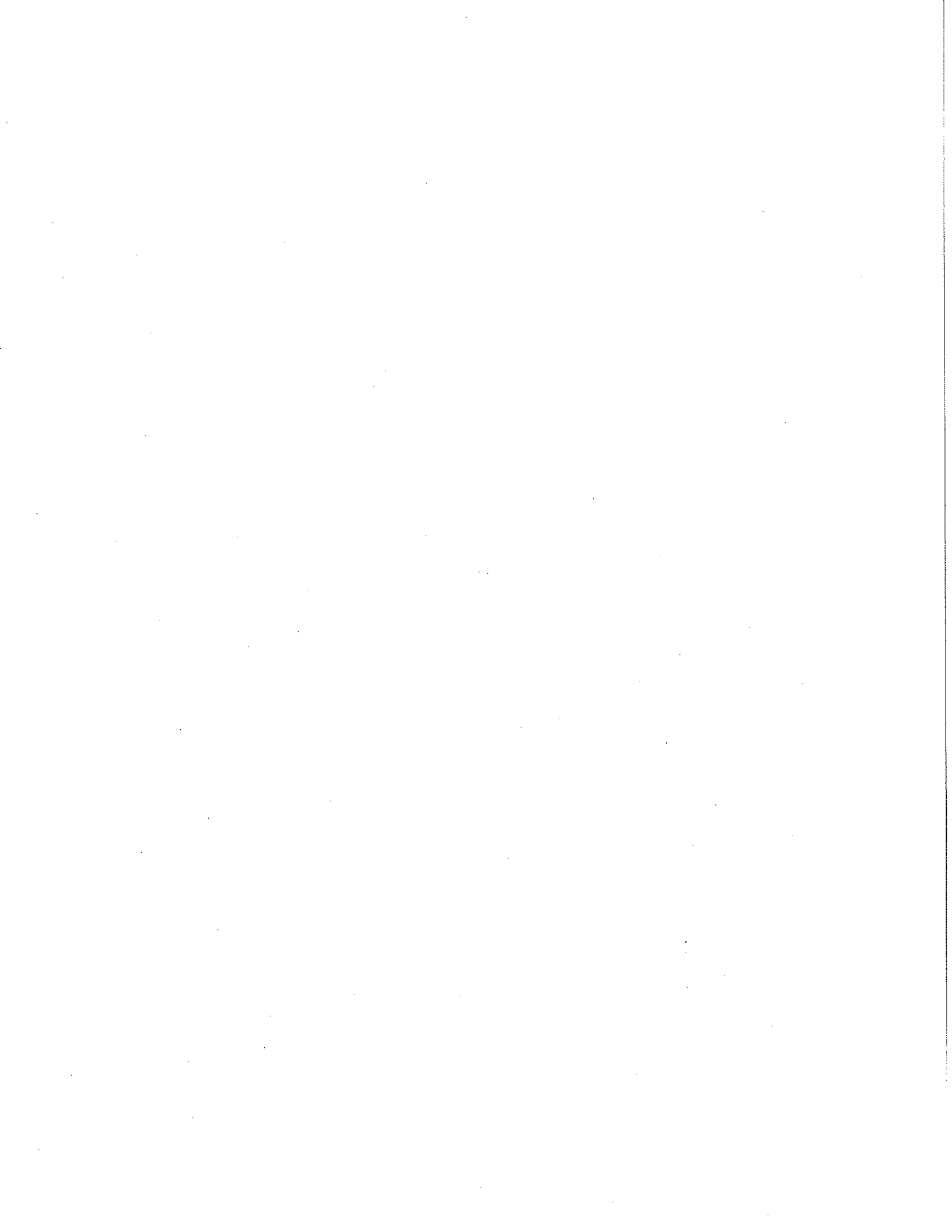
# Highway Problem Areas Jefferson County, WV

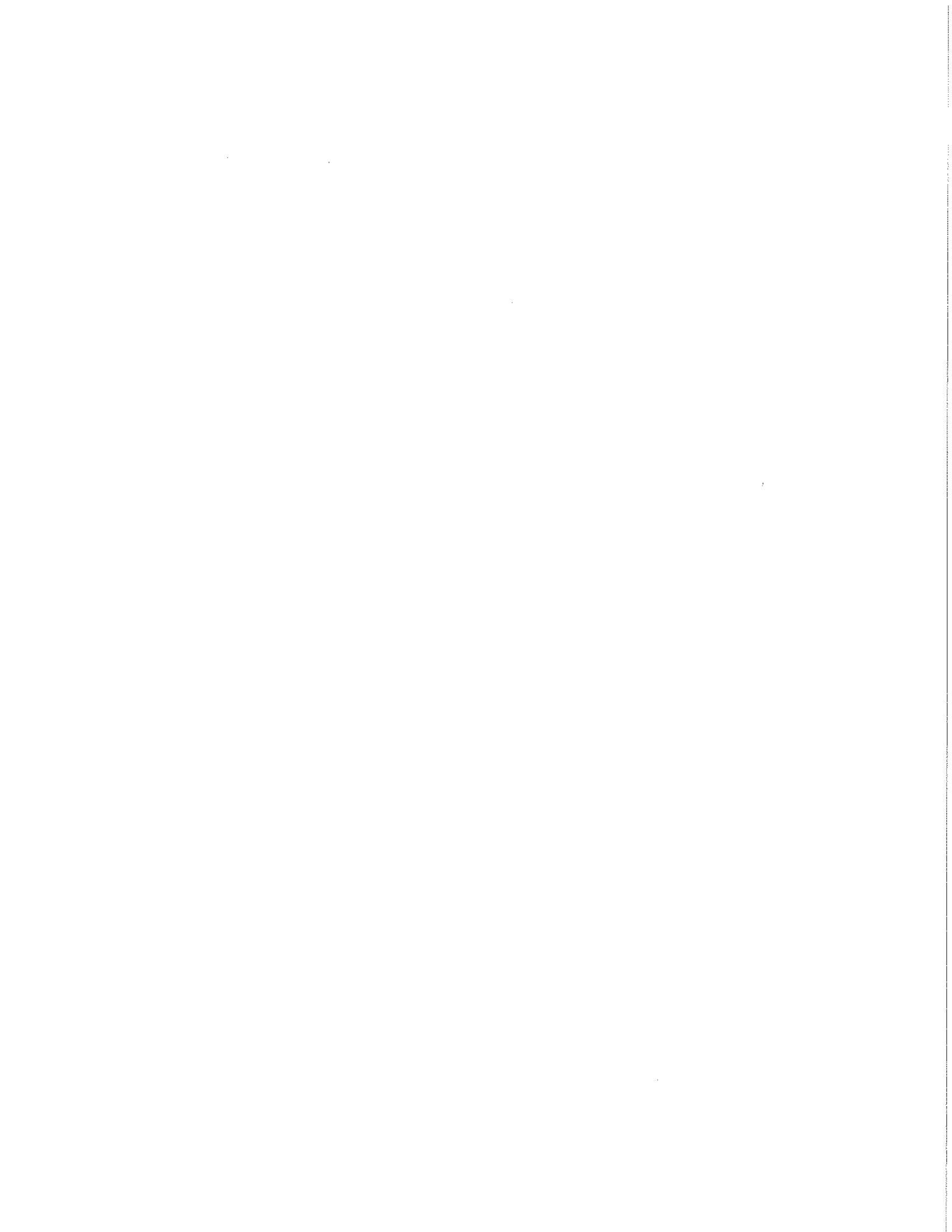

### Information Technology 2016-2017 Data Content Management Exploration Review Update

For the budget year of 2016-2017 the Information Technology Department began a new initiative to utilize a data content management system that would improve business processes, reduce redundancy and allow a more efficient way of accessing the county data.

Research and review of software and systems led the team to select Alfresco as a low cost software platform that could support the counties efforts in the above intellectual design efforts.

Testing of implementation and configuration led the team to decide that outside professional services would be required to achieve our goals. After discussions, the writing of a request for proposals was undertaken and vendors were invited to submit proposals. Submitted proposals ranged in price from \$24,800 to \$62,300.

After vetting each proposal and the companies that submitted them we decided to rewrite the low bidder's proposal to accommodate the county's needs. We identified the following points that we felt we had to have within our final statement of work before embarking on this project. These points are as follows:

- The county desires to be trained on how to configure/administer and maintain the software and system in-house.
- The county desires to have the ability to pause, stop work indefinitely or terminate the contract at any time for any reason. This would be because of the project not achieving our goals, budget constraints or other reasons.
- The county desires to have the statement of work address events in the timeline of the project that should be achieved within certain cost objectives.

At this time, the rewritten statement of work more accurately reflects the county's goals and stays within the approved budget as we begin our implementation. We would invite our commissioners to visit with us to discuss this new initiative and the exciting prospects of making county government processes more efficient and friendly to our citizens.


Dear Commission:

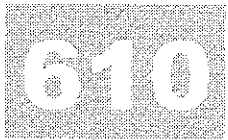

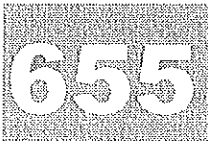

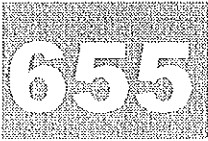

## Jefferson County Public Service District Regular Board Meeting December 5, 2016

Jefferson County Commission

The monthly meeting of the Jefferson County Public Service District was held at 7:00PM on Monday, December 5, 2016 in the meeting room at the Districts office in Kearneysville. Those in attendance included: Chairman, Peter Appignani; Secretary, Dick Weese; Treasurer, Bill Strider; General Manager, Susanne Lawton; Administrative Assistant, Ashley Stottlemeyer; from Thrasher Engineering, Wayne Morgan; from Bowles Rice, Tyler Mayhew and liaison for the County Commission, Commissioner Jane Tabb.

### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Peter Appignani called the meeting to order at 7:00PM.

### Approval of agenda

There were no changes made to the agenda and it was approved with unanimous consent.

### OLD BUSINESS

#### Review Minutes of November 7 regular board meeting

The minutes of the November 7, 2016 regular board meeting were approved as presented.

**Action:** Motion made by Mr. Strider and seconded by Mr. Weese to accept the November 7, 2016 regular board meeting minutes as presented. Unanimously approved.

#### Discuss sewer collection and transmission project

- o Consider for approval the resolution # 8 to pay Crawford Law Group for easement services relating to the sewer collection and transmission project from the Series 2015 Sewer Bond proceeds
- o Consider for approval the resolution to authorize the treasurer to sign documents for State Revolving Funds
- o Consider for approval condemnation for pump station site in Beallair for project

The Board called Mr. Rodecker for this discussion. Mr. Appignani recused himself from this discussion per the Advisory Opinion 2015-08 by the West Virginia Ethics Commission.

Ms. Lawton requested the Board approve resolution number eight (8) to pay Crawford Law Group \$3,408.34 out of the \$660,000 loan for easement services for the project. Mr. Strider read resolution #8 as follows:

RESOLUTION OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD OF THE JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT APPROVING INVOICES RELATING TO ENGINEERING AND OTHER SERVICES FOR THE SEWER TRANSMISSION IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT THEREOF IN THE AMOUNT OF \$3,408.34.

**Action:** Motion by Mr. Strider and seconded by Mr. Weese to approve the resolution as read totaling \$3,408.34. Approved 2-0. Mr. Appignani recused himself.

Ms. Lawton also informed the Board that WV DEP is requesting a form, similar to the USDA form, to give signing authorization to the Treasurer for project related documents. Mr. Strider read the resolution as follows:

AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION AT THE REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING OF THE JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT HELD ON DECEMBER 5, 2016, WILLIAM H. STRIDER HAS BEEN DULY AUTHORIZED TO ACT ON AND SIGN ON BEHALF OF THE JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC

SERVICE DISTRICT ANY AND ALL FEDERAL AND STATE ACTIONS AS THEY RELATE TO PLANNING, DESIGN, AND/OR CONSTRUCTION OF THE FLOWING SPRINGS TRANSMISSION PROJECT, A WASTEWATER COLLECTION PROJECT THAT WILL ELIMINATE OLDER PUMP STATIONS AND PROVIDE A GRAVITY COLLECTION SYSTEM WITH A NEW MAJOR PUMP STATION AT A LOW POINT IN THE FLOWING SPRINGS WATERSHED. THIS MOTION BEING DULY PRESENTED AND SECONDED HAS BEEN ADOPTED BY A QUORUM VOTE AND THEREFORE WILLIAM H. STRIDER MAY SIGN ALL SUCH DOCUMENTS RELATIVE TO WASTEWATER FACILITIES ON BEHALF OF JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC SERVICE DISTRICT.

**Action:** Motion made by Mr. Strider and seconded by Mr. Weese to approve the resolution as read. Approved 2-0. Mr. Appignani recused himself.

Ms. Lawton, with Thrasher Engineers, has been in discussion with the Wormald Companies about an easement needed for the Flowing Springs Collection System Project. The Wormald Companies are willing to grant the District the easement with several expensive stipulations and a much higher cost than the appraised value offered by the District. Ms. Lawton has requested the Board approve the District moving forward with condemnation of the site since there has not been success in the negotiations.

**Action:** Motion made by Mr. Strider and seconded by Mr. Weese to move forward with condemnation of the site for the Halltown Pump Station. Approved 2-0. Mr. Appignani recused himself.

Consider for approval the RFPs for billing software vendor

Last month the District received four proposals for billing software and the Board requested a breakdown of costs the District spends each month with the current system and how much will be saved after new software is installed before making any decisions. Ms. Lawton provided the Board with a spreadsheet on the needs of a new system and the amount of customer complaints on the current system. Mr. Strider supports the purchasing of a new system. Mr. Weese questioned if the District purchased a new system and consolidation occur soon after. Mr. Appignani requested again a cost benefit analysis and for Ms. Lawton to contact the other utilities to get quotes on billing District customers.

**Action:** Motion made by Mr. Strider and seconded by Mr. Weese to request staff contact Charles Town about billing logistics and include a cost benefit analysis for next month's meeting. Unanimously approved.

Discuss the District's financial status (status of paying bills)

The District will need to collect an estimated \$11,000 in payments to cover the disbursements for water.

**Action:** No action required by the Board.

**NEW BUSINESS**

Consider for approval the request from Jefferson Utilities, Inc regarding the Districts Westridge Hills well

Tyler Mayhew, attorney from Bowles Rice, stated that Jefferson Utilities, Inc. had sent a request to acquire the Westridge Hills well that is owned by the District. Since this item is subject to negotiations, the Board went into executive session to discuss. Mr. Kelsh was called and Commission Jane Tabb was invited to participate in the discussions.

**Action:** Motion made by Mr. Weese and seconded by Mr. Strider to go into executive session to discuss the request from Jefferson Utilities about acquiring the Westridge Hills well from the District. Unanimously approved.

**Action:** Motion made by Mr. Strider and seconded by Mr. Weese to return to public session. Unanimously approved.

Commissioner Tabb has agreed to take the issue to the County Commission and provide feedback to the District since the County paid for the initial study of the wells. There was also a representative from the Westridge Hills HOA in the audience, Kathryn Jackson, Vice President of the HOA, who stated the members of the HOA are against this request and will use the first right of refusal that is in the deed with the District as needed. The Board tabled the discussions until they hear feedback from the County Commission.





Dear Director Clark:

It is with great pride and respect for our coveted West Virginia 4-H Program that we write in opposition to the proposed personnel changes to the 4-H Agent position we were made aware of in recent weeks. In our view, the faculty status component of all county Extension 4-H Agent positions will be downgraded in the near future, a move we feel is unacceptable. While we understand state budget shortfalls and policy changes may be a factor in this decision, we feel this will be a disservice to our youth and will lessen the impact of our high quality programming. In fact, this proposed change is neither in the best interest of the program, as a whole, nor in the best interest of the youth who participate.

We contend that 4-H youth development programs currently offered in West Virginia are evidenced based and data driven with proven outcomes. By utilizing best practices and new innovation garnered by continued scholarly coursework, research, and professional development, we will continue to offer high impact programs of excellence. Thus, it is essential to keep a tenure tracked faculty position, with its educational requirements, in place for these agents and the 4-H unit teams they serve. Also, a faculty component gives the incentive to attend professional conferences and network with other professionals in youth development and education as a means to broaden the scope of programming brought back to the local level where it is being utilized on a daily basis.

Additionally, by keeping a faculty component intact, national funding for programming and youth development will not be jeopardized. The National 4-H Council, as the fundraising arm of 4-H, leans heavily on an evidenced based, faculty driven model for program and curriculum development when incentivizing major donors to contribute to the National 4-H program. This is what separates 4-H from other youth development programs. West Virginia 4-H is highly respected at National 4-H Council and has been the recipient of several major grants that allow our program to provide quality, evidenced based projects with proven outcomes, to the citizens and youth of our State. These major grants not only provide funding for specific programs and projects, but support WVU Extension's budget. West Virginia receives these grants from the National 4-H Council because of the quality, faculty driven work our state 4-H program provides.

More importantly, our local Jefferson County Extension Program has a rich tradition of success and community support. As a collective group, we have worked diligently over the past decade to not only retain our Extension Agent faculty positions, but have invested in such through the continued support of the Jefferson County Commission, Jefferson County Board of Education, Jefferson County 4-H Foundation and countless Leaders, Volunteers and Supporters who value our agents and the work they do.

Moreover, our continued population growth and high 4-H programming standard in West Virginia's Eastern Panhandle have seen our program continue to grow and expand. Our 4-H program is supported by well-established lifetime volunteers and is built on the success of community based clubs. This long standing tradition of programming excellence is the foundation for our growth and has paved the way for other high impact programs. One of the best examples of this is our Tri-County 4-H Camping Program where we have three age appropriate camps, Younger, Intermediate, and Older 4-H camps which are directed by an Extension faculty member from Berkeley, Morgan, and Jefferson Counties, respectively. Our Camping program is also the only local camping program accredited by the American Camping Association which is in large part driven by our local faculty 4-H Extension Agents.

Due to the recent vacancy of our Extension 4-H Agent position, we understand Jefferson County will be the first county to experience these personnel changes. We respectfully reject this action and for the reasons mentioned beforehand, ask that the faculty member position requirements remain intact. We hope you will support our affirmations and find clarity as these final personnel decisions are being evaluated.

Thank you in advance for your attention to this important matter. As you move forward with this process, we would appreciate the opportunity to speak with you at your earliest convenience.






