Project Summary

1. Brief description of the proposal

Jefferson County Parks and Recreation seeks to expand and construct outdoor public spaces for the health and well-being of its community through the construction of the outdoor tennis (3)/pickleball courts(3) in Jefferson County to be located at James Hite Park.

2. Purpose and key anticipated outcomes

The Jefferson County Parks and Recreation Commission is requesting support from ARPA Funding to expand capacity of outdoor recreational opportunities for residents of Jefferson County.

Studies show the population of Jefferson County is growing at a rate of 7.55%, which means Jefferson County is the 3rd fastest growing population in the State of West Virginia, behind Berkeley County (growth of 17.61%) and Monongalia County (growth rate of 9.07%) (https://worldpopulationreview.com/us-counties/states/wv (https://worldpopulationreview.com/us-counties/states/wv)

3. Individuals or communties served

Jefferson County Parks & Recreation provides recreational and arts programming for the entire population of Jefferson County including those of Charles Town, Ranson, Bolivar, Harpers Ferry, Shepherdstown, and Shenandoah Junction. Currently, JCPRC provides indoor pickleball for residents.

4. How the COVID-19 pandemic has necessitated this request

Early in the COVID-19 pandemic WV provided a list of essential services and public outdoor space was prominent on the list with outdoor recreation identified as an essential activity, even during the periods of stay-at-home orders.

Efforts to navigate the COVID-19 pandemic response while keeping public health a priority made evident the importance of public outdoor spaces and programs that allow for social distancing to occur. Coronavirus has helped the sport of pickleball continue its participation growth across the United States, much due to the ability to social distance.

According to the Sport and Fitness Industry Association (SFIA), pickleball participation grew by a whopping 21.3% last year as Americans looked for new ways to stay active during the pandemic. (https://www.bbc.com/news/world-us-canada-56324048 (https://www.bbc.com/news/world-us-canada-56324048))

And it's sociable, a big bonus during the pandemic when people have been struggling to get together safely. As gyms and other recreation centers closed, pickleball became a popular outdoor alternative.

Participation and interest in outdoor activities grew faster than previous years. While this is likely due to response to COVID-19, growth continues to remain higher than any other measured data, including grocery stores, workplaces, transit, and more. The value in outdoor recreational opportunities has been noticed and celebrated in West Virginia and around the United States. If new opportunities for shared community experience in our parks become available, it is reasonable to expect this momentum and appreciation for outdoor spaces to be maintained or grow.

Proposal Details

1. Please describe the problem or need which your project seeks to address

As outdoor space continues to be at a premium due to the pandemic, JCPRC anticipates continued high usage through the remainder of this public health crisis. Moreover, as population growth continues, JCPRC anticipates continuous growth in usage for the foreseeable future. With the strain on indoor and outdoor facilities, JCPRC finds it necessary to expand infrastructure and build outdoor spaces for the community to gather, while still providing social distancing opportunities. There are currently no dedicated pickleball courts in Jefferson County

2. Please describe goals and expected outcomes of your proposal.

When this project is complete, James Hite Park will have three pre-lined tennis/pickleball courts. The average Pickleball player is between the ages of 37-50. This means the courts will be used by a segment of Jefferson County that is rarely utilizing other recreation or sports facilities in the park systems at the same rate. The expected outcome is to have more people of more ages centering health and wellness activities into their daily lives; a vitally important goal given current adult obesity rates in Jefferson County and our community.

6. Please describe your plan for sustainability of the project or initiative after the grant award has been exhausted.

Once construction is complete, the pickleball courts at James Hite Park will be open and available to the public for play from sunrise to sunset daily. The local pickleball community has already exhibited high standards of the condition of the courts, so it is anticipated they will become unofficial partners to help keep the courts in acceptable condition, however general maintenance of the courts, parking, and surrounding fields at the park will become part of the seasonal and full-time maintenance staff who are already maintaining our parks. This project is not expected to raise concern for future budgetary needs beyond general, appropriate maintenance of the courts.

Jefferson County Parks and Recreation exists to provide places and recreation opportunities for all people to gather, celebrate, contemplate, and engage in activities that promote health, well-being, community, and the environment. Its mission is to take a leadership role in harnessing resources for planning, developing, implementing, evaluating, and operating a county-wide system parks, recreation, conservation areas, and trail opportunities for people who live, work, and visit here.

2. Describe the history of your organization, tell us about your current programs and activities

The Jefferson County Parks and Recreation Commission (JCPRC), established in 1970 per WV Code Chapter 7, Article 11, is a component unit of the Jefferson County Commission. As specified in WV Code 7-11-3 the commission consists of eleven members who are bona-fide residents of the county and own real estate within the county, each serving a term of three years.

JCPRC, a 501c3 organization, operates or maintains nine county parks that encompass over 400 acres of park land and a variety of park facilities, including the Jefferson County Community Center, the AMP, picnic pavilions, concession stands, walking trails, playgrounds, tennis courts, athletic fields, and open space. In addition, JCPRC offers over 400 program opportunities each year to youth and adults in the county. As part of programming, JCPRC offers numerous special events each year. JCPRC generates approximately 51% our budget from revenue-based programming and facility rentals.

3. Please describe three significant accomplishments of your organization.

AMP at Sam Michaels Park – 40 year project brought to fruition

JCPRC offers over 400 programs, events, and activities per year for our community that promote public health already in place. Additional programs will be added as parks grow- In the last fifteen years, JCPRC has received close to \$3,000,000 in Grant funding that has helped to exponentially grow the impact of Jefferson County Parks tax allocations and impact fees collected over the years.

Impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic

1. Please explain the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and how it relates to your request.

Early in the COVID-19 pandemic WV provided a list of essential services and public outdoor space was prominent in the list with outdoor recreation identified as an essential activity, even during the periods of stay-at-home orders. Park usage in WV grew is estimated to have grown 200% over pre-pandemic levels.

Populations flooded public parks in response to mitigation of the COVID-19 pandemic. When theaters, gyms, restaurants, and school classrooms were closed, families and whole communities flocked to parks, trails, disc golf, tennis, etc.

2. How will ARP funding, if awarded, aid in the recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic?

Populations flooded public parks in response to mitigation of the COVID-19 pandemic. COVID-19 responses redirected activities and focus to outdoors, which elevated the urgency to further develop and maintain park spaces in Jefferson County. Pickleball brings a community together. Adding pickleball courts to our community will help enhance recreational experiences for our older active population.
