


#### Concept Plan – Proposed Conditions

- 1. The applicant will submit a well monitoring plan with the site plan. The plan objectives include the following:
  - 1. With Property Owner consent, private wells within ½ mile of the Supply Well shall be monitored. A baseline for all wells within the study area shall be established prior to start of operations at the bottling plant.
  - 2. Wells within the study area shall be replaced by the applicant when the following two conditions occurs.
    - 1. Yield of the wells are reduced by drawdown at the Supply Well.
    - 2. The reduced yield is not sufficient for residential use (as defined by the Jefferson County Health Department) or the existing use of the well.
- After start of construction for the bottling plant, Property Owners within 1,000' of the Supply Well can request a new well at any time up to 2 years after the start of plant operations. The well shall be provided upon request by the applicant and not subject to the well monitoring plan requirements.
- 3. The intersection of Route 51 and Leetown Road will be signalized prior to the start of plant operations.

West Virginia State Code Chapter 22 Environmental Resources Article 26 Water Resources Protection Act

#### Definitions

(10) "Large-quantity user" means any person who withdraws over three hundred thousand gallons of water in any thirty-day period from the state's waters and any person who bottles water for resale regardless of quantity withdrawn. "Large-quantity user" excludes farm use, including watering livestock or poultry on a farm, though farms may voluntarily report water withdrawals to assist with the accuracy of the survey.

(20) "Withdrawal" means the removal or capture of water from water resources of the state regardless of whether it is consumptive or nonconsumptive: Provided, That water encountered during coal, oil, gas, water well drilling and initial testing of water wells, or other mineral extraction and diverted, but not used for any purpose and not a factor in low-flow conditions for any surface water or groundwater, is not deemed a withdrawal.


§22-26-3. Waters claimed by state; water resources protection survey; registration requirements; agency cooperation; information gathering.

• Large-quantity users shall register with the department and provide all requested survey information regarding withdrawals of the water resources.


§22-26-6. Mandatory survey and registration compliance.

• All large-quantity users who withdraw water from a West Virginia water resource shall complete the survey and register use with the department.


# Large Quantity Users – Jefferson County




## Large Quantity Users – Project Area

### Jefferson County Zoning Ordinance

Section 1.3 Application and Interpretation

D. If a proposed use is not one in the list of the principal permitted or conditional uses in each zoning district, it shall be prohibited as though it was included in the list of prohibitions. Applicants desiring inclusion of a use not specifically permitted in this Ordinance may apply for a text amendment, following the provisions outlined in Article 12 of this Ordinance.

The following infrastructure is not on the list of principal permitted uses in the zoning ordinance for the Rural District.

- Power lines
- Fiber lines
- Telephone and communication lines
- Sanitary sewer mains
- Water mains
- Drain fields

- Natural gas lines
- Storm water ponds
- Wells residential, agricultural or production

All of these infrastructure categories are fully and adequately regulated through federal, state and county regulations. Their absence from the principal permitted use list does not prohibit them.


#### Jefferson County Subdivision Ordinance

Division 20.200 Types of Development

Unless explicitly stated within the individual sections listed in this Division, all requirements of these Regulations apply to each of the types of development listed below. ..... Excluded are developments for the purpose of extraction or harvesting of resources and for roads on agricultural land for the purpose of conducting the agricultural operation

Sec. 20.204 Major Site Development

Major site developments are those proposals that require the development of new infrastructure or the extension of off-tract infrastructure or where the proposal does not meet the definition of a minor site development. .... <u>Excluded are developments for the purpose of extraction or harvesting of resources and for roads on agricultural land for the purpose of conducting the agricultural operation.</u>
