This Indenture made this thirty first day of August in the year of our Lord one-thousand eight hundred and one between Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife of the county of Spotsylvania of the one part and John Kearsley, John Davenport, William Little, Joseph Swearingen, John Briscoe, William Darke, Richard Baylor, Alexander White, George Hite, Daniel Collett, George North, Abraham Davenport, Van Rutherford, John Packett, Daniel Morgan, Jacob Bedinger, and Ferdinando Fairfax, Gentlemen of the county of Berkeley of the other part.

Whitnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar current money of Virginia to the said Samuel Washington in hand paid by the said John Kearsley [indecipherable] before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof doth release, acquit and discharge the said John Kearsley [et al.] and their executors and administrators by these presents, they the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said John Kearsley [et al.] and their heirs four half lots of ground situate in Charlestown and county of Berkeley aforesaid lying on the corners of Washington and _____ [sic] Street running the length of half a lot on Washington Street and the full depth of a lot on [sic] Street, being the same lots appropriated by Col. Charles Washington in his lifetime for the public buildings in case a division should take place of the aforesaid county of Berkeley, which has taken place, and all houses, buildings, orchards, ways, waters, water courses, profits, commodities, hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises hereby granted or any part thereof belonging or in any wise [sic] appertaining and the reversion and revisions remainder and remainders rents, issues and profits thereof and also all the estate right title interest use trust property claim and demand whatsoever of them the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife of, in and to the said premises and all deeds, evidences and writings touching or in any wise [sic] concerning the same to have and to hold the lands hereby conveyed and all and singular other the premises hereby granted and every part and parcel thereof with their and every of their appurtenances unto the said John Kearsley [et al.] and their heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of them the said John Kearsley [et al.] and their heirs and assigns forever in trust notwithstanding that one of the aforesaid lots is to ensure

to the inhabitants of the town of Charlestown for the purpose of erecting a market house thereon the remaining three lots for the purpose of erecting the public buildings thereon and the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife for themselves, their heirs, executors and administrators do covenant promise and grant to and with the said John Kearsley [et al.] and their heirs and assigns by these presents that the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife now at the time of sealing and delivering ++++++ [sic] of these presents are seized of a good, sure, perfect and indefeasible estate of inheritances in fee simple of and in the premises hereby granted and that they have good power and lawful and absolute authority to grant and convey the same to the said John Kearsley [et al.] in manner and form aforesaid and that the said premises now are and forever hereafter shall remain and be free and clear of and from all former and other gifts, grants, bargains, sales, dower right and title of dower judgments, executions, titles, troubles, charges and encumbrances whatsoever made, done, committed or suffered by the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife or any person or persons whatsoever, the land tax imposed by law only excepted and foreprised, and lastly that the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife and their heirs and all singular the premises hereby granted and released with the appurtenances unto the said John Kearsley [et al.] and their heirs and assigns against them the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife and their heirs and all and every other person and persons whatsoever shall warrant and forever defend by these presents in [indecipherable] whereof the said Samuel Washington and Dorothea his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year above written.
