Scope of Work

The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission desires to purchase and have installed a playground structure that is inclusive, ADA accessible, unique, eye catching, aesthetically pleasing and safe for children. Playground will have poured in place surfacing or a combination surfacing. The proposer will be required to provide sufficient documentation to define the items being provided in this scope of work. Such documentation may include, but is not limited to, vendor catalog sheets, general data sheets, drawings and sketches or specification and warranty information.

1. The amount budgeted for this purchase is not to exceed \$130,000 with delivery and installation to be made no later than Spring 2024. A Fall 2023 installation is preferred. Liquidated damages of up to \$100 per day will be assessed if project is not completed by the due date.
2. Vendors should include either pictures of their play structures or 3 dimensional drawings of what is being proposed.
3. Vendors will be required to provide a supervisor for installation.

Laws and Regulations

1. Attention is directed to the fact that this project will be undertaken with public funding. All work must be performed in accordance with the rules and regulations of all public agencies, including Jefferson County, WV; the State of West Virginia, and the Federal Government. Current prevailing wage rates are applicable to this work. Contractors submitting bids for this project must be licensed and insured to work in the State of West Virginia.

Site Specifications

1. Playground Components (desirables/minimum requirements):

- a. Recommended for ages 2-12.
- b. Equipment must fit in an area that is approximately 80'x100'
- c. Poured in place
- d. Inclusive/Adaptive components
- e. Handicap swing and/or generational swing.
- f. At least two slides.
- g. At least three sensory elements.
- h. Must have at least two overhead/upper body climbing components and two ground level components.
- i. Approximately 12 play elements are desired.
- j. All handrails and gripping surfaces shall have a texture.

2. Border Material:

- a. Sufficient border material and certified mulch to encompass the use zone of the composite structure. Play structure shall have a plastic border with a rounded opening kit that allows for easy access into the playground.

3. All bid packages must include specifications and warranty of the equipment proposed along with a top view and color drawing. There shall be two separate drawings showing the play structure area and a separate drawing showing the climbing apparatus in relation to the existing freestanding slide.

4. If applicable, the JCPRC will obtain any permits needed.
5. Manufacturer shall be ISO 9001 certified and the designer and factory certified installer shall be certified by the National Playground safety Institute. All equipment and installation must as a minimum meet the following standards.
 - a. ADA-American with Disabilities Act
 - b. ASTM-The American Society for Testing Materials
 - c. IPEMA-The International Playground Equipment Manufacturers Association
6. Vendor must note on his or her bid any variation to the specifications, warranty and additional requirements for this bid. Failure to note any deviations or changes to the specifications, warranty or requirements may at the sole discretion of the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Board void the proposal.

Project Location: Playground will be located at Sam Michaels Park, Shenandoah Junction, WV.

Project: The scope of work involves the Contractor to provide, as a requirement of the Base Bid contract, mowing and line trimming at the specified locations and services described in the attached Specifications.

Preparation of Bids:

Each bid shall be submitted on the Bid Form furnished in these documents. All bids must be written in black ink or typewritten, and signed with the legal signature of the Bidder, enclosed in an opaque envelope, sealed and clearly marked showing the bid identification, and date and time of opening in the lower left-hand corner. The envelope must also contain the name and address of the Bidder. The Bidder must ensure that the "sealed bid" envelope is properly identified. Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission (the "Owner") will not be responsible for the premature opening of bid envelopes that are not properly marked. Any bids opened prior to the scheduled bid opening due to the Bidder's failure to properly mark the envelope in accordance with this section shall be deemed non-responsive and will not be considered.

Taxes:

The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission is not subject to Federal or State Tax.

Addenda and Interpretation:

All interpretations and requests for interpretations of the Bid Documents must be made in writing. Any addenda shall become part of the Contract Documents.

Acceptance or Rejection of Bids:

The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids and/or waive any non-material informalities and/or technicalities in the bids received.

Bids will be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder on the total of all work items in the Base Bid, or in any combination of Base Bid and alternates that Owner deems, in its sole discretion, to be in its best interests. Whether a bidder is responsible will be determined using all submitted information, all publicly available information, references, demonstrated experience, and service reputation.

The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission reserves the right to accept in whole or in part, to reject and/or to separate any or all bids or adjust estimated quantities to meet its needs consistent with its budgetary constraints, if any.

All documents and signatures called for in these specifications must be included with the bid to constitute a valid bid, namely: 1) Bid Proposal Form; 2) Bidders Acknowledgement; and 3) Reference Sheet.

Non-Discrimination Clauses / Equal Opportunity:

During the performance of the contract, the Contractor agrees as follows: In connection with the performance of work under this contract, the Bidder agrees not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of age, race, religion, color, handicap, sex, physical condition, developmental disability, sexual orientation or national origin. This provision shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Bidder further agrees to take affirmative action to ensure Equal Employment Opportunities. The Bidder agrees to post in conspicuous places, available for employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the contracting officer setting forth the provisions of the Equal Opportunity Clause.

Site Protection:

The Contractor shall be responsible for adequate job site safety protection. The park area is used daily by the public and adequate protection for park users must be provided.

Damage to Other Work:

Should the Contractor, his agents, or his works, or any of his subcontractors or material cause damage to the Owner, or to the work or materials of other contractors or person, the damage shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor. The repairs and replacing of damaged work shall be under the direction of the Owner or his representative, and the cost of same shall be the responsibility of the Contractor causing the damage.

Standards:

The work hereunder shall be done in a thorough, workmanlike manner. The successful bidder shall be required to enter into an Independent Contractor Agreement generally in the form provided herewith.

Payment:

Terms for payment are as follows: **Payments shall be no more frequently than monthly.**

Invoices shall be typed and sent to Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission containing the following information:

1. The name, address, and phone number of the Contractor.
2. Any payment discount terms offered.
3. Invoice number (payment will not be made from a statement).
4. An itemization of all labor and materials provided.
5. Completed W-9 form.

Contractor Performance:

The general conditions of this contract shall together constitute the contract. The Contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, and materials necessary to perform the services provided under this contract. The Contractor will provide all proper safeguards and shall assume all risks incurred in performing its services hereunder. The Contractor will pay all salaries and expenses of, and all federal, social security taxes, federal and state unemployment taxes, and any similar payroll taxes relating to their employees and will carry Workmen's Compensation Insurance for its employees. The Contractor will be considered for all purposes hereunder independent, and it will not at any time directly or indirectly act as an agent, servant, or employee of the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission or make any commitments or incur any liabilities on behalf of the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission without its express written consent.

Insurance:

Contractor shall obtain insurance of the types and in the amounts listed below:

A. Commercial General and Umbrella Liability Insurance

- a. Contract shall maintain commercial general liability (CGL) and, if necessary, commercial umbrella insurance with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence.

B. Workers Compensation Insurance

- a. Contractor shall maintain workers compensation as required by state and employers' liability insurance. The commercial umbrella and/or employers liability limits shall not be less than \$1,000,000 each accident for bodily injury by accident or \$1,000,000 each employee for bodily injury by disease.

C. General Insurance Provisions

a. Evidence of Insurance

- i. Prior to beginning work, Contractor shall furnish Owner with a certificate(s) of insurance and applicable policy endorsement(s), naming the Owner as an additional insured and executed by a duly authorized representative of each insurer, showing compliance with the insurance requirements set forth above.
- ii. All certificates shall provide for 30 days written notice to Owner prior to the cancellation or material change of any insurance referred to therein. Written notice to Owner shall be by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- iii. Failure of Owner to demand such certificate, endorsement, or other evidence of full compliance with these insurance requirements or failure of Owner to identify a deficiency from evidence that is provided shall not be construed as a waiver of Contractor's obligation to maintain such insurance.
- iv. Owner shall have the right, but not the obligation, of prohibiting Contractor or any subcontractor from entering the project site until such certificates or other evidence that insurance has been placed in complete compliance with these requirements is received and approved by Owner.
- v. Failure to maintain the required insurance may result in termination of this Contract at Owner's option. With respect to insurance maintained after final payment in compliance with a requirement above, an additional certificate(s) evidencing such coverage shall be promptly provided to Owner whenever requested. Contractor shall provide certified copies of all insurance policies required above within ten (10) days of Owner's written request for said copies.

D. Indemnification

- a. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify the Owner, its officers, commissioners, officials, employees, volunteers, and agents from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses including but not limited to legal fees (attorney's and paralegals' fees and court costs), arising out of or resulting from the performance of the Contractor's work, provided that any such claim, damage, loss, or expense (i) is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or injury to or destruction of a tangible property, other than the work itself, including the loss of use resulting there from and (ii) is caused in whole or in part by any wrongful or negligent act or omission of the Contractor, any Subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, except to the extent caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or

person described in this Paragraph. Contractor shall similarly indemnify the Owner, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, and agents against and from any and all claims, costs, causes, actions and expenses including but not limited to legal fees incurred by reason of Contractor's breach of any of its obligations under, or Contractor's default of, any provision of the Contract.

- b. The indemnification obligations under this paragraph shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation, or benefits payable by or for the Contractor or any subcontractor under Workers' Compensation or Disability Benefit Acts or Employee Benefit Acts.

Inspection of Materials/Equipment:

The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission shall have a right to inspect any materials or equipment to be used in carrying out this contract. The Contractor shall be responsible for the contracted quality and standards of all materials, equipment; components or completed work finished under this contract up to the time of final acceptance by the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission. Materials, equipment, components or completed work not complying therewith may be rejected by Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission and shall be replaced by the Contractor at no cost to the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission.

Any materials, equipment of components so rejected shall be removed within a reasonable time from the premises of Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission at the entire expense of the Contractor.

Parking and Traffic:

Parking of vehicles on the site by the Contractor shall not inhibit construction nor prevent access for emergency or other official vehicles. Parking of private vehicles on the site by the Contractor is prohibited unless said vehicle is necessary in the execution of the Contract. No construction vehicles shall be parked near or under any existing vegetation on the site.

Cleanup:

The Contractor shall walk the site at the close of every workday to assure it is either free of waste material and rubbish, or the waste material and rubbish is secured in a container that is inaccessible to park patrons.

2. **Service Requirements:**

- a. High quality craftsmanship will be expected in all phases of work. Any elements found unacceptable and not in compliance with the Contract Documents will be removed and replaced by the Contractor until satisfactory results are obtained.
 - i. A meeting with park manager before the grass cutting season to go over site specifications and areas to mow at each park will occur a week prior to start of contract.
 - ii. Weekly mowing from April 3 to October 31, 2023.
 - iii. Bi-weekly trimming from April 3 to October 31, 2023
 - iv. The entire site shall be picked up of trash and debris before mowing begins.
 - v. Mowers shall be set to cut at 4" for general park areas and 3"-3.5" for athletic fields (depending on season and weather) for the length of the agreement. The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission staff shall have the right to check equipment for compliance.
 - vi. Final trimming around permanent objects such as trees, shrubs, posts, fences, play equipment, benches, signs, etc., shall be accomplished with suitable mechanical equipment and at the same cutting height as the rest of the turf areas, to be performed at every other mowing.
 - vii. Picking up or bagging of cut grass and raking of leaves are not normally required.
 - viii. **Mowing patterns shall be such that the clippings are evenly distributed, not windrowed into noticeable clumps or deposits.** Altering mowing patterns every week shall be required with distributed grass clippings may have to be picked up. Grass clippings shall not be allowed to accumulate on hard surface areas, sidewalks, or roadways. Sidewalks shall be blown off after each mowing. Mowing patterns will be established and equipment operated so that the height of the cut is uniform, and no scalping occurs. Trees, shrubs, and other plants shall not be damaged by running into them with the mowing equipment. The first two (2) passes along property boundaries shall be blown inward to prevent blowing of clippings onto adjacent property. Clippings shall not be blown into playground safety surfacing. Clippings shall not be blown into planting beds or mulched areas.

- ix. Mowing equipment shall be kept in good, safe operating condition with sharp blades so that the grass is cut properly, and in such condition that oil and gasoline are not leaked. Property safety guards shall be in place.
 - x. Mowers shall not be fueled or oiled in grass areas; they shall be moved to paved or gravel areas for this function. All fuel or oil spills will be cleaned up immediately.
 - xi. Any vandalism, storm damage to the park areas or to any of the trees, shrubs, play equipment, park equipment, or objects located in the park area shall be reported to the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission as soon as possible by the Contractor. Contact person for reporting these issues is the Park Manager, Tim Michael at 304-261-5811 or tmichael@jcprc.org.
 - xii. The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission shall notify the Contractor by written email when failures to perform the above stated duties are noted and Contractor shall respond back via email or phone acknowledging receipt. If after a written 48 hours' notice the Contractor fails to perform any of the above stated duties, Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission shall have the right to perform said work and back charge the Contractor for performing the work or withhold the appropriate portion of payment for that location. The rate for remedial work shall be no less than \$50.00 per man hour to cover the cost of the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission and equipment.
 - xiii. The Contractor shall ensure their mowing is completed Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. The list of park locations with their approximate acreage has been provided and the winning Contractor should use this to set their mowing schedule for the day the work shall be performed at each location, ensuring the work is completed from Monday through Friday between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4 p.m. The schedule shall be provided to the Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission prior to the start of the season. The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission should be notified via email of any changes to the weekly schedule due to weather/turf conditions. Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission will notify the winning Contractor in the event a schedule change is needed due to conditions that would hinder the mowing services such as maintenance work, improvement projects, etc.
 - xiv. All efforts should be made to protect park users and property by not discharging towards people or vehicles or trim where people or property may be impacted. Any injury of the public should be immediately reported.
- b. The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids in its discretion without disclosure of reason.
 - c. The Jefferson County Parks & Recreation Commission is exempt from all Federal and State tax. Bidders must quote prices, which do not include such tax.
